Disclosure Statement Regarding the Status of the Associate Degree Nursing Program at East Arkansas Community College, Forrest City, AR

The following publicly available information is provided by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) concerning the accreditation of the associate degree nursing program at East Arkansas Community College, Forrest City, AR. Information presented below is in accordance with ACEN Policy #5 Notification of Commission Decisions. ACEN staff cannot comment further on questions specifically related to the associate degree nursing program at East Arkansas Community College

What is the accreditation status of the associate degree nursing program at East Arkansas Community College?

On September 8-10, 2021, the ACEN Board of Commissioners voted to deny initial accreditation to the associate degree nursing program at East Arkansas Community College.

Why did the ACEN Board of Commissioners vote to deny initial accreditation to the associate degree nursing program at East Arkansas Community College?

The ACEN Board of Commissioners voted to deny initial accreditation for failure to comply with Standard 6 Outcomes, Criterion 6.2, of the ACEN Standards and Criteria. Standard 6 expects that program evaluation demonstrates that students have achieved each end-of-program student learning outcome and each program outcome. Criterion 6.2 expects the program demonstrates evidence of graduates' achievement on the licensure examination. What will happen next?

Per ACEN Policy #10 Appeal Process and Submission and Review of New Financial Information Subsequent to Adverse Action, the associate degree nursing program at East Arkansas Community College has 30 calendar days after receipt of official notification in which it could submit a written notice to initiate an appeal. The ACEN must receive the official notification by 5 pm Eastern Time, November 8, 2021.

If East Arkansas Community College submits an official notification to initiate an appeal, then the ACEN will initiate the appeal process and the Appeal Hearing will be scheduled per the timeline outlined in Policy #10.

If East Arkansas Community College does not submit an official notification to initiate an appeal, then the ACEN will not initiate the appeal process.
